

Elmswell Scout Troop were fortunate enough to be offered the opportunity to camp on the John Brown and Sons farm in Hawstead, Suffolk during August 2014.

Using a greenfield site such as this on private land gave the 30 strong Scout troop freedom to exercise some of the Scouting skills that would not be available on public camping grounds. For example all the Scouts were initially sceptical of the solar showers. But they were all persuaded to try the showers and were pleasantly surprised at the heat of the water. The Leaders were also thankful to see a brief return to cleanliness.

The Scouts were split into patrols to try out activities such as map reading and hiking, firelighting, air rifle shooting, fishing and pioneering which were all carried out in the immediate area. The daily routine of flag ceremonies, cooking and washing-up, collecting water and an all-important campfire with songs and skits were all essential tasks that the secure site enabled, as well as safe access to the river Lark.

The Scouts went to the local Lackford Lakes near Bury St Edmunds for a day of sailing, kayaking, rafting and hiking which was an amazing day out in the sun after recent heavy rain, and returned to Hawstead for a well-earned hearty supper and marshmallows that evening.



The week was thoroughly enjoyed by all and gave this young generation a fantastic opportunity to develop their Scouting and leadership skills. 


#### A DOUBLE SUCCESS IN HAWSTEAD

### A REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENT BY OUR LOCAL FARMERS



Suffolk Agricultural Association's annual Farm Business Awards took place this year over a couple of days in June.

There are three categories of farms, small, medium and large. **John Brown & Sons** came *First* in the **Large Category for Farms over 400 Hectares**.

The Judges commented

'We felt that John Brown & Sons was a justified winner, if only by the narrowest of margins. Their business, and enterprise management was carried to an exceptionally high standard. This became very evident when talking to **Mr R Brown** and his father, and looking at the impressive crops they had grown in this very testing season. They pay a great deal of attention to the environment, with land in the Organic entry level Scheme and ELS.

They also have a number of very successful diversification enterprises, including a venue for weddings and parties, a holiday let, fishing, and a soil screening business.'

Church Farm had previously won this competition in 2010, 2011 and 2012. In 2013 they came third and won again this year.

Many Congratulations to The Brown Family and all concerned in gaining this award.

### HAWSTEAD WINE CLUB - SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER

Our **September** meeting was presented by *Norman* and *Ann*. Their wines were purchased from *Majestic* and included some of their top selling 'newcomers'. A Shiraz from Chile was in first place, hotly followed by a 2004 Rioja. Interestingly none of the wines featured in our top three were white. Third place was taken by a Rosé from the Luberon in Northern Provence.

On the 30<sup>th</sup> **October** *Richard* and *Jacquie* chose a theme of *'Loire Valley Wines'*. This was inspired by a holiday they had enjoyed several years ago in the area. As they found it was not easy to source wines from this region, although Waitrose appeared to have more on their shelves than any other outlet. Our favourite was a sparkling Chenin Blanc from Aldi with a terrific price of £6.79 - well worth stocking up for Christmas and parties. Second place was given to a Pouilly Fume Sauvignon Blanc from Waitrose. Waitrose also gave us our third choice a 'Les Nivieres' from the Saumur area which is solely Cabernet Franc grape.

Both these evenings were greatly enjoyed and we look forward to our November presentation, which will be hosted by *Ruth* and *Bridget*.

### HAWSTEAD READING GROUP

Our **September** meeting was held at *Janet Watson's* where we enjoyed lovely canapés including smoked salmon blinis.

We were a smaller group than usual but had a lively discussion about "The Elegance of the Hedgehog" by Muriel Barbary. The novel follows Renee the concierge of an apartment block for the rich, who hides her intelligence behind what she conceives to be the stereotype of her social role and Paloma, a 12 year old brain box who plans to kill herself on her 13th Birthday! Renee leads a lonely life and Paloma detests the vacuous privileged life she leads until a new resident, Kakuro Ozu - a cultured Japanese businessman arrives who perceives their separate loneliness and breaks through their shells to encourage them to reveal their true natures.

Originally published in 2006 in French this philosophical book was quite a departure from other books we have read but most finished it and were glad they stuck with it!

On 1st **October** we met at *Geraldine West's* to discuss "The Bat" by Jo Nesbo. Quite a dramatic contrast from the "Hedgehog" this is Nesbo's first novel written in 1997 and not published in English until now following his detective Harry Hole.

Set in Australia Norwegian *Harry* has been sent to help Sydney police investigate the murder of a Norwegian girl on a gap year. When the team unearths a string of unsolved murders and disappearances the hunt for a serial killer is on but he will only speak to *Harry!* For *Harry Hole* fans this is a disappointing book and none of the group found it a particularly good read which is written in quite a male chauvinistic manner. As my first *Nesbo* book I have to say it put me off reading another although I gather this is not up to his usual standard.

On a positive note we had a very enjoyable evening which was well attended and *Geraldine's* ginger cake was delicious!
