

Tayfen Road / Out Northgate / Compiegne Way and Northgate Street, Bury St Edmunds - Junction improvements

These improvements will increase vehicle capacity, efficient traffic movements around the roundabout and improved pedestrian and cyclist facilities.

Works information

Start date: Monday 22 January 2018

Planned end date: Saturday 12 May 2018

Duration: 16 weeks

The junction improvements will include extending the two lane approach along Compiegne Way to the Northgate roundabout and widening and reconstructing the shared foot and cycle path. The scheme will also result in upgraded street lighting and a new toucan crossing.

Phase 1: Tayfen Road

Start date: Monday 22 January 2018

Planned end date: Saturday 24 February 2018

Duration: 5 weeks

The first phase of the improvements will involve installing the toucan crossing at the junction with the roundabout and Tayfen Road. The shared footpath/cyclepath will be widened and reconstructed and whilst the road closure is in place, part of Tayfen Road will be resurfaced.

Traffic management

Tayfen Road will be closed for the first four weeks of phase 1. Temporary traffic signals will be operating to support the traffic flow for the duration of this closure.

Diversion route:

Tayfen Road, Station Hill, Fornham Road and vice versa

The outer lane of the Northgate roundabout will be closed for the full duration of the junction improvements.

Phase 2: Out Northgate

Start date: Monday 26 February 2018
Planned end date: Saturday 7 April 2018

Duration: 6 weeks

The shared footpath and cyclepath will be widened and reconstructed along the Tayfen Road side of Out Northgate.

Traffic management and restricted parking

For the duration of the second phase, the lane in the direction away from the roundabout will be closed along with the outer lane of the roundabout remaining closed.

Parking along Out Northgate will be suspended for the duration of phase 2.

Diversion:

Tayfen Road, Station Hill

Phase 3: Complegate Way

Start date: Monday 9 April 2018

Planned end date: Saturday 12 May 2018

Duration: 5 weeks

Compienge Way will be widened throughout the third phase. This will enable the extension of the two lane approach to the Northgate roundabout. The new road lay out will result in two in-bound lanes and 1 outbound lane.

Traffic management

A contra-flow system will be in operation to control traffic flow along Compiegne Way, this will be in place for the duration of the last phase. On completion of phase 3, the outer lane closure will be removed.

Overnight resurfacing


Part of Northgate Street and Compiegne Way will be closed overnight to complete resurfacing. The dates and extent of the resurfacing will be confirmed and detailed closer to the time. You can find details on the web page below.

Working hours

Suffolk Highways has planned these works to be delivered six days a week (Monday – Saturday) to reduce the length of time on site.

Information for residents and businesses

Pedestrian access will be available to properties and businesses in the area immediately around each phase of the works. Staff on site will be able to answer any questions and help you safely get in or out of the area. Once any road closure is in place, vehicular access to your property may be temporarily unavailable for periods of 15-20 minutes, for example, if we are digging up the road outside your property or laying a new surface. We will work to ensure this is kept to a minimum. Through traffic will be required to follow the signed diversion.

Businesses: We understand that businesses need to know that customers can still visit so, where appropriate, we will display "Businesses open as usual" signs.

Noise: We will use vehicles, heavy machinery and equipment that will create noise; however we will keep the noise to a minimum where possible.

Other services have been notified of these works including emergency services, local bus operators and St Edmundsbury Borough Council for bin collections.
