Basic Emergency Supplies

We suggest that you keep the following items at home:

- Torches and spare batteries
- Oil and/or battery operated lamps
- Battery operated radio
- Mobile phone / telephone not requiring electricity
- Heating and cooking source not requiring electricity, such as a camping stove and spare gas cylinders
- Bottled water / water containers
- Tinned and dried food
- First aid kit
- Sufficient supplies of any essential medication

Emergency Plan

The purpose of the plan is to ensure the safety and wellbeing of villagers in the event of an emergency, especially those who are vulnerable.

The emergency plan will operate when there is:

- A prolonged power cut
- Roads made impassible as a result of snow, fallen trees, flooding etc.
- Disruption or contamination of the water supply
- Chemical spillage
- Severe property damage resulting from fire, flood, storm etc.
- A major accident or incident

The **Emergency Plan** is overseen by Hawstead Parish Council who have put in place an Emergency Planning Team, together with volunteer 'First Responders' located throughout the village (See Page 2).

A decision to activate the plan will be taken by the Emergency Planning Team who will brief volunteers and liaise as required with the emergency and other services and with St Edmundsbury Borough Council. They will brief volunteers and ensure that, where possible, appropriate help is provided.

Shelter, warmth and food can be provided at the village hall which has its own generator, cooking facilities other emergency supplies.

It is important that the Emergency Planning Team has up to date information about vulnerable villagers and villagers with skills and equipment that can be called upon in the event of an emergency. 	wall of the village hall to the left of the entrance door.
