The Covid-19 vaccine is our best defence against the virus, alongside effective social distancing, wearing a mask and washing our hands. Getting vaccinated will protect you, and may also help to protect your family, friends and patients from the virus.

The vaccine has been developed and approved following a number of clinical trials involving thousands of people across the world. It has also undergone mandatory safety tests to ensure it is safe.

It is given in two doses by your local NHS service. The doses will be given up to 12 weeks apart based on updated guidance from the UK's chief medical officers.
