Hawstead's Play Area - Update

Please be aware that should there be any periods of significant rain and as a result flooding occurs in the playground area, we have been advised by the local authority that we will be required to lock the gates and close the play area until flooding subsides. This is unfortunate but is beyond our control... it's a health and safety requirement due to the additional risks associated with standing water posed to children. If you find the play area flooded but not locked, please contact a member of your community council immediately.

Hawstead Community Council has engaged with professional engineers and liaised with the parish council in search of a solution to the winter flooding. We can assure you that we continue to work towards an agreed and affordable solution.

We are hoping to start general works on the play area as soon as ground conditions permit. As a minimum, we hope to address some rotting in the play equipment, install new wider access gates and deal with the playbark surface. Finances and space permitting, we may even be able to add some new equipment. If so, we'll be in touch with the village children to see what they'd like!

Special thanks to Andy Parrett and his team of willing volunteer mowers, weeders and strimmer-ers who completed the penultimate Hawstead Churchyard Tidy Up of 2024 on Saturday 5 October. It's a great opportunity to spend time in the beautiful grounds, get some fresh air in great company and feel part of the community in maintaining our beautiful heritage asset. Plus there's always tea/coffee and biscuits/cake on offer.

The tidy ups are typically held monthly on a Saturday morning and for an hour or two (please bring along any hand or motorised kit you may have), usually running from 10am onwards. The main jobs generally include cutting, strimming and keeping the weeds under control. There is a roped off area at the rear of the church where the aim is to encourage wildflowers, and this is maintained under the guidance of Suffolk Wildlife Trust who suggest this should only be cut a couple of times a year. There is hope for more swifts to nest in the Swift Hotel in the church tower. Please keep a look out for future 2025 tidy up dates.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council: vacancy

On behalf of the village, the Parish Council would like to thank Penny Barham for her unstinting contribution to the Parish Council and her unfailing optimism and good sense. Following her resignation for family reasons, we now have a vacancy. As required by law, this has been advertised on the website and noticeboard, stating that any six residents of the parish may call for an election. As no application for this was received, we are now in a position where we can co-opt someone.

If you would like to put your knowledge, skills and interests to the service of the village, we would love to hear from you. Alternatively, if you know someone who you think would do a good job, let us know and perhaps together we can persuade them to put their name forward. The only stipulation is that they live or work in the parish and are over 18.

Our job as a Parish Council is to: ensure that village amenities are well cared for; be aware of national and regional decisions that may affect the village; and represent village interests in matters like planning. We have a schedule of meetings every 2 months, with the occasional additional meeting for urgent planning matters. Footpath representative

The Parish Council is looking for a local volunteer who might be able to walk the footpaths in the village regularly and flag any issues to the Council in order to make sure the Council is aware of problems with overgrowth/obstruction/missing waymarkers, etc. The Council meets every 2 months, and ideally we would welcome a brief report before each meeting. This could be a simple phone call/text/email to say 'no problem', or brief details of any problems. This role would suit a dogwalker or keen walker who enjoys using the local footpath network regularly. Pinford End Phone Kiosk Book Exchange

The Parish Council is pleased to maintain a defibrillator in the telephone kiosk at Pinford End. Fortunately it has not yet had to be used, but it is important that the equipment remains accessible in an emergency.

The phone kiosk is also used informally as a book exchange where residents can swap novels. While this is a great idea in principle, unfortunately the kiosk is now home to more paperbacks than it can handle!

Easy access to the defibrillator itself is essential. So we need some feedback on whether the kiosk is being used and enjoyed by residents as an active book exchange or is it simply being used as a location to drop unwanted books? If you are a resident who uses the kiosk as a book exchange and thinks it is a valuable asset for the village, it would be good to hear from you.

If it is a valuable village asset, would you be interested in helping keep the kiosk in good order by controlling the number of books, removing old stock and ensuring good access to the defibrillator? Please do get in touch to let us know if you value the use of the kiosk as a book exchange and want it kept in use. Contact clerk@hawstead-pc.gov.uk with your thoughts.

In the meantime, the Parish Council appeals to all residents to use the book exchange responsibly and to refrain from depositing additional books when there is insufficient room.
